A reminder from the Board to all our members to treat your lawns and control the spread of dandelions'. These pesky weeds will spread if not controlled and YOUR DENDELIONS will become your NEIGHBORS DANDELIONS. We recommend that lawns are mowed once a week to control growth and maintain a good appearance. Homeowners are responsible to maintain their swales in the same manner.

READ THE RULES AND REGULATIONS IT IS AN IMPORTANT REFRESHER

Domesticated Fashion (Landscape)

Lawn should be maintained regularly. This includes mowing and trimming as needed, and at a frequency that allows for a good visual appearance. Lawns need to be watered and fertilized regularly to maintain a healthy appearance.

Weed care is important and it is every homeowners responsibility to keep weeds controlled and to a minimum. Weed care is important for your lawn as well as your neighbors! Weeds are considered anything other than grass, and should be controlled by hand or by chemical means. You can easily tell the homeowners that make an effort and those that simply don't. Weed control also extends to driveways, curbing and streets outside your property.

Gravel and fringe areas need to be kept weed free.

Shrubs and trees should be pruned to maintain a good visual appearance and to keep them from over-occupying their space and infringing on any common area, such as sidewalks.

Fall clean-up of leaves and debris should be performed as appropriate.

The general intent and purpose of the above rules for lawn and landscape maintenance is to keep all lawns neat, free of unsightly weeds, and free of unhealthy or overgrown shrubs and tree, as well as promote and maintain uniform appearance and the value of all properties.
